Thomas Turnpenny of 14, John Street, Commercial Road, said he was the landlord of the Chester Arms, Chester Street, Kennington Lane but by trade a printer and 62 years of age. He is a married man but does not know if his wife is alive or dead. She became his barmaid but started to live as man & wife for three years. Although he was responsible for mistreating her and not providing enough care while indulging himself with drink the verdict by the jury was death from consumption was by natural causes.

From the censuses he was a Printer most of his life and it looks as though he split from his wife before 1861. Perhaps he fell on hard times and she kicked him out !

Thomas Turnpenny, 30, printer, pleaded "Guilty" to an indictment charging him with having feloniously married Charlotte Shepherd, his wife Sarah being alive. Daily News. Saturday February 12th 1887. Bankruptcy Act 1883. Turnpenny, Walter Daniel Talbot (trading as W.D.T.Turnpenny and Co) Red Lion Court, Cannon Street, Button manufacturer.

Birmingham Post. Wednesday 15th June 1887 & Thursday 11th August 1887. Bankruptcy Proceedings. W.D.T.Turnpenny applied for discharge of debt totaling £6438-6s - 5p by offering his creditors 8/6 in the £, but they refused to accept therefore winding up his assets hence rejecting his application for three months.

Reynolds Newspaper. Sunday 9th June 1889. Tuesday Adjudications. T. Turnpenny 3, Watling Street, City, Button Warehouseman. (Looks as thought he changed his full name)

The Bristol Mercury & Daily Post. Saturday 29th November 1890. A Cheltenham Libel Action. Walter Daniel Turnpenny was called to court to stand for the defence of his niece who was claiming libel against her employer which they won.

Note. On the census 1891 the family were listed as "Sampaney". Also Jane Henrietta Jackson was living with them employed as a sick nurse, no doubt looking after his wife as she was dying of cancer.

There were other indictments against the prisoner for felony, which were ordered to remain on the files of the court.

#### Never found where Walter served his prison sentence.

George Henry Talbot Gilbourne was found guilty of forging and cashing cheques from Walters account. Must have known he was in prison, note the name Talbot was he related ?

The Times 6th July 1894. - Sitting in Bankruptcy before Mr Registrar Brougham in re Turnpenny.

A petition was recently presented against W.D.T.Turnpenny, who was sentenced to three years penal servitude for administering noxious drugs to females. He is described as a button agent of Lawrence Lane, City, and late of Vicarage Road, Leyton. His Honour now granted the usual receiving order. The amounts of the liabilities does not appear. The assets are stated to comprise cash at a safe deposit £1000, also jewelry and furniture.

Between 1888 and 1891 approx he was also known as "Westbrook"

Conclusion - They were divorced in 1894, after his prison sentence he must have gone up to Leicester to try and patch things up with Mabel and had another child, but at some time before his death he moved back to his fathers and stepmothers house in London, where he died. His wife and one son appear to have moved to Weston, where she and her son died. Also note that all the Spouses shown were either from marriages, his court cases or divorce.

On the baptism of his son Sydney on the 20th March 1895 his name was recorded as Walter Daniel Timothy Turnpenny, Occupation Traveller also note this event occurred after he split from his wife Jane.

Forence M Harper was born (date unknown). Named in the divorce in 1894 by Mabel Nellie Taylor - Florence another mistress.
